



It all started when Moorswood founder Charles Fanshawe was out training with his local search-and-rescue team on Dartmoor, he thought, "Wouldn't it be nice to have something to sit on when we pause for a cuppa?". Wishing to avoid the flimsy foam seat pads on the market, Moorswood developed their own line of Field Rugs made of tweed and waxed cotton and available in a range of sizes: the picnic blanket-sized 'Dart Roll', the single-person 'Ramblers Roll' (left and above), and – for a forest bathe (or snooze in the woods) – the longer length 'Forest Roll'. The rugs come in a variety of designs, including this oak leaf print by Cornish artist Lou Tonkin (pictured).



our last wilderness

There's something otherworldly about the salt marsh that wraps around the Norfolk coast - an eerie, intertidal landscape where freshwater and salty sea merge. Embark on a 'Salt Marsh Sail' with Coastal Exploration Company and let the tide carry you deep into this remarkable landscape on an engineless mussel flat, where you can pause to swim in the creeks, forage for samphire and cockles and feel the mud oozing between your toes, before feasting on a locally made Norfolk brunch and letting the outgoing tide pull back into the harbour.

with courage

Travelling the coast in a decommissioned ambulance, photographer Jack Lowe is capturing the crew of all 238 RNLI lifeboat stations in the UK and Ireland using a method called wet plate collodion. At each lifeboat station, he captures three things: the boathouse view (of the waters they're protecting), a portrait of every coxswain or senior helm and a group portrait of the volunteer crew. The technique is unapologetically analogue, and far from simple: chemicals are applied to glass, which are then exposed to light through his 1905 camera and processed in his mobile darkroom, *Neena*. The resulting images are irreproducible and uneditable, capturing the humility and generosity that exist

within coastal communities and lifeboat crews.

We spoke to Jack for issue five of *Ernest* (2016), when he was one year into his project. Since then, his journey has unfolded in unexpected and remarkable ways. Five years and 150 lifeboat stations in, Jack's coastal travels came to an abrupt pause when social distancing restrictions were announced in March 2020. Taking the opportunity to reevaluate his project, Jack built an independent membership platform called The LSP Society, then went on to develop an app for iOS and Android where members can connect, access extra films, audio, blog posts and online talks, while helping Jack to see this historic odyssey through to completion.
